Meeting began at 8:40a.m.

Melissa Lucero opened in prayer and welcomed everyone.

Erin Berge shared devotion on LOVE and how it consists of giving of ourselves to others.

Mr. Fell started with a big thanks to the PAC on behalf of all the teachers; they are very appreciative of all that the PAC does for the school. He reported that the teachers are very pleased with how the "Foundations and Frameworks" program is going this year, they also feel the overall consensus from the students is that they seem to be excited about it. The teachers are looking forward to using it again next year. Registration for next year is currently open to CWCS families and is looking good for next year. In March, enrollment will open to the community as well. He assured us that the school's intent is not to raise tuition or fees of any kind, but for us to keep in your prayers the financial means of the school. On behalf of the school, Mr. Fell has given us an expense request form for the recent purchase of the copy machine in the teachers lounge; they are asking that we as the PAC give as much as we feel led, to help out with this expense.

Julie Potts gave a reminder for the Teacher Appreciation Lunch that will be held Thursday, Feb. 11th at noon in the cafeteria. If you are bringing items have them there at 11:30 am, no later, and she passed around the list of needed items for those of us who would like to still sign up for something to bring. An e-mail will be sent out for any left over items and reminders on what you are bringing.

Lenni Jo Copeland gave us her idea for an Art Show at the end of the year. She had a 4th grade student that suggested we send art to children in Haiti to cheer them up. This heart felt child gave Lenni Jo an idea to do an Art Auction with the proceeds going to Haiti. Lenni Jo is willing to figure out what this is to look like, but would like to make a committee to help her with this. Anyone interested please contact her. The PAC has decided to check into avenues in which we would send the proceeds and also brainstormed some ideas for crafts that would be pretty universal to auction or sell to anyone's families. Lenni Jo gave a big thanks for all the craft donations she has been receiving in her box; she appreciates them all. Erin Berge also informed us that it is time again for the Google Doodle art competition. The contest is open to all students and flyers will be sent out this week. The national winner gets a \$15,000 scholarship toward any college of their choice and \$25,000 for their current school's computer lab, so encourage your students to enter! Also, pray about the PAC funding the Art Program for the upcoming school year!

Brandy Auker informed us that all the books that she has requested for the library have been approved and she is in the process of ordering and receiving new books from the funds granted by the PAC. THANK YOU PAC!

Melissa Lucero reported that we would need to come up with another avenue in which to proceed with our Shining Knight Student Spotlight for the newspaper. We still want a student's photo and brief summary of why they were selected, but need to come up with a way to choose the student most fairly. We as the PAC feel that this would be great advertisement for our school, but it will also encourage our kids to step up and do better, nicer, and kinder things for the kids and staff around them. We agreed that Brandy Auker, Julie Potts, Danielle Kistler, and Kelly Yergenson will be the committee to figure out how this will work and implement into our 2010-2011 school year.

Erin Berge has informed us that Hug a Tree (a program that promotes safety and survival for families in desperate situations in the woods or outdoors) would like to come in and do a safety evening for our students and families. Derek Medina and Randy King will come in and show a short DVD as well as give some visuals on how to stay safe if separated from your group or family in the outdoors. The PAC has picked Thursday March 18th, 2010 at 6:30 p.m. The program will last approximately one hour. More info will be sent to the staff and families soon.

Kelly Yergenson gave our financial report of approximately \$2,800 with few recent expenses.

The PAC needed to vote on reimbursing the school \$256.38 for art expenses, but Lenni Jo Copeland wanted to confirm the expenses first as she was not remembering what was purchased, so it's been tabled until next meeting until we have the details.

Kelly Yergenson informed everyone that she and two other moms are starting up a "Girls on the Run" program here at CWCS for 3rd through 6th grade girls. The goal is to be able to run a 5K in April, but meanwhile they will have practices that will consist of running and a devotional in each session. The program is about girl time, God time, self-confidence and exercise! The registration is \$40 due in Feb. and the forms will be sent home soon.
